On behalf of the Scientific and Organising Committee, we take pleasure in inviting you to the 3<sup>rd</sup> International Congress on ADHD – From childhood to adult disease, which will be held in Berlin, Germany, 26–29 May 2011.

The 1<sup>st</sup> Congress in Würzburg was the first international meeting solely dedicated to this exciting topic. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Congress in Vienna was again a big success and step forward gathering outstanding scientists on ADHD from all five continents as well as more than 1.800 participants from over 70 countries. An excellent collection of scientific sessions will be prepared based on suggestions of the members of the international Scientific Program Committee: interactive educational seminars, plenary lectures with rewarded experts, hot topic symposia, video sessions and guided poster tours. Young scientists are especially encouraged to present their recent finding in Young Scientist Sessions and thus benefit from the congress.
