

## **Guidelines for Submission**

- **Presentation type**
  - Poster presentation
  - “Young scientists” presentation (more information can be found at "[Additional information](#)"). The members of the Scientific Programme Committee will select eight abstracts for a “Young scientists” presentation.
- **Abstract title**
  - Please choose a title that clearly indicates the content of your contribution. Please avoid abbreviations in the title. Abbreviations may be used in the main text if they are defined when first introduced.
- **Author and co-author details**
  - Full first and family name(s)
  - Affiliation details: department, institution/hospital, city, country
  - Degrees, titles, street addresses and acknowledgements of support should be omitted.
- **Abstract text**
  - limited to 300 words  
(Please note that word count is affected by graphs/tables/images)
- **Abstract layout**

Abstracts must be submitted with the following sections:

  - Objectives:  
indicate the purpose of the study or the hypothesis that was tested
  - Methods:  
include the setting for the study, the subjects, the diagnosis or intervention, and the type of statistical analysis. If references are needed, they should be given in the text
  - Results:  
present as clearly as possible the outcome of your study and, if appropriate, show the statistical significance
  - Conclusions:  
briefly discuss the data and show the significance of the results
- All studies must be approved by **Ethics Committees of experimental and human investigations** beforehand.
- Disclosure of interests or conflicts of interest: Work submitted for presentation must include an acknowledgement of any commercial funding sources. Authors should declare all commercial interests.
- The abstract submission must be complete. The topic of the abstract must be allocated to a specific topic of the scientific programme. Please choose from the list of topics.
